Hoopeston FMC plant to be sold, closed by new owner

Approximately 35 jobs will be lost when Hoopeston's FMC plant is sold and closed.

FMC announced Friday it is selling the local agricultural harvester operation to OXBO International Corporation, headquartered in Byron, NY.

The sale is expected a close Dec. 15, when OXBO International is expected to transfer production to its Byron facility and close the Hoopeston plant.

Currently, 35 people work at the Hoopeston facility. A

small number them may be offered jobs by OXBO, according to a press release issued Friday by FMC.

Employees were told of the plant closing Friday, prompting a weekend meeting of leadership of the local PACE International Union, AFL-CIO.CLC.

Local president Tim Lane said a committee was to meet Sunday with a union representative to discuss what things the union would like to see included in the sever-

employ 100-200 people," he said, adding the plant, which was extensively redone after a July 2001 tornado, "is in tip-top shape."

While Flint has no leads now, he said the building could be used as an assembly plant for products manufactured overseas. He plans to check with Illinois officials about possible tenants.

The plant's closing was not a shock, Flint said, because about six months ago, the company turned down a five-year contract to produce cotton pickers for a Rockford business. "It's not a shock but it still hurts," he said.

FMC has been part of Hoopeston since 1928 when the John Bean Manufacturing Company acquired the Sprague-Sells canning facility and changed the name to Food Machinery Company. The local plant designed and manufactured specialty vegetable harvesters and, at its heyday, employed about 400 people.
