Alderman Bill Goodwine questioned the suggestion, wondering if the city should maintain control. However, Flint said, that might stifle the development. "This town has not grown in 30 years and that's basically the reason why," he said. Nobody wants to take a chance. Nobody wants to trust the other guy."

In related discussion, Walker recommended creating two new TIF districts - of farm property owned by Larry Petry east of Euclid, planned for residential development, and of the former Baer Motel property. Both properties were planned for the original TIF district but were not included, Petry's because of delays in a development agreement and the motel property because it was not annexed to the city.

By creating new TIF districts, Walker said, the city can generate new life into its TIF plan. The existing TIF is currently in its fourth of 23 years. New districts could extend TIF benefits to the city for an additional four years.

Also, the city could save some money on creating new districts rather than amending the existing TIF. Taxing

bodies and residents within the TIF must be notified of changes by certified letter. Amending the TIF would mean all residents in the TIF area would have to be notified; by creating new districts, which would include fewer residents than the main area, postage costs would be less. Also, meetings of joint review boards, public hearings and ordinances could be done together.

The issues related to the TIF are expected to be voted on at the Feb. 17 council meeting. "We need to let the developer know if he should stop or go forward," Flint said.

In unrelated business, the council:

• heard from Jerry Northam, former human resources director at Silgan Containers, about an upcoming union election at the plant. Workers will vote Feb. 19 whether to join the Teamsters Union, and company officials are asking community leaders to influence workers to keep the union out.
