

ROSSVILLE SEES OWN GREAT CHICAGO FIRE

ROSSVILLE—Firefighters from 21 departments converged on Rossville Friday night to fight what is believed to be the largest, most costly fire in the village's history.

The blaze, which started shortly after 7 p.m., is believed to have begun in Royal Line Pizza, 112 S. Chicago. Witnesses reported an explosion, which may have been caused by a gas line leak. Investigators from the Illinois State Fire Marshall's Office sifted through the wreckage Saturday to determine the exact cause.

The fire is believed to have started in the back of the building, which also contained apartments. From there, flames danced to buildings north and south, eventually engulfing the entire block, turning the stores, many of which housed antiques, to ashes.

Store owners, village residents and others converged on the downtown area to watch one building, then an-

Rossville blaze takes more than buildings from residents

ROSSVILLE—Naomi Freeman sat in a building on the east side of Chicago Street Friday night and watched her life go up in smoke.

Freeman, owner of Freeman's Folly, 110 S. Chicago, lost more than most in the blaze that decimated the

block of Rossville's downtown. She lost her business, her home and a lifetime of memories.

Until the block was evacuated, Freeman watched from a building across the street as first smoke, then flames claimed all of her possessions.

While a dollar estimate has not been established, the cost in human terms will be immeasurable.

Shop owners poured their money and their hearts and souls into buildings that were turned to charred rubble. Some, like Freeman and barber Ralph Larkin, had been in the village for many years. Others, like Cindy Mahoney, had only recently opened a shop.

For Mahoney and her husband, Tom, there was a bit of good news. A safe found in the rubble of their building was intact. The safe contained important family papers, such as the couple's marriage license, abstract for their home and their children's birth certificates.

Whether any of the business owners will rebuild is not known.

The downtown was a part of the village's newlyformed Tax Increment Financing district. A part of the village's sales tax revenue went up in smoke with the buildings.

The area was also part of Rossville's history and charm. Watching firemen work Friday night, Mayor Terry Prillaman talked about what was now in each building and the history of each. Shrugging off the moment of reminiscing, Prillaman readied to face the challenges of the fire.

"I'm going to start calling Springfield (Saturday)," he said. "I don't know if anybody will be in but if they are, I'm going to talk to them. I'm going to see about getting some help."

other, and another begin to smoke, then flame.

No one was hurt in the fire, although three Hoopeston firemen received minor injuries when a backdraft threw them from a doorway.

As the fire spread, officials evacuated the downtown and a surrounding two-block area. One of the families evacuated was that of village trustee Mark Catron. Catron was bowling when he received a call from his wife, Dara. "I never get calls at the bowling area so I knew something was wrong," he said. Mrs. Catron told her husband the family was being evacuated. "I came right home," Catron said. "Fortunately, they were alright."

As departments converged on the village, they were divided to fight the fire in a two-tiered approach, along Chicago Street from the front and in an alleyway from the rear.

Firemen came from Hoopeston, Bismarck, Middlefork, Danville, Rankin, East Lynn, Milford, Lynch, Kickapoo, Wellington, Gifford, St. Joe, Homer, Ogden-

Royal, Westville, Georgetown and in Indiana, West Lebanon, Perrysville, Covington and Hickory Grove (Ambia).

Rossville and Hoopeston emergency personnel also responded. EMTs worked in vain to restrain the crowd of onlookers that gathered at the scene.

Some residents did more than just watch. EMTs and other volunteers took bottled water to thirsty firemen. Dennis Price, local physician's assistant and school board president, was among those who took water to firefighters. Area businesses in Rossville, Hoopeston and Danville donated food and in Rossville, residents cooked and took the food to a shelter for firemen and volunteers.

Hoopeston provided much of the water used to fight the fire. Trucks rotated between businesses and fire stations in Hoopeston and Rossville where they pumped water into holding tanks. The strain proved too much for water mains near Dollar General and Iroquois Federal. The lines broke causing personnel to travel to Rankin and Danville for water.
