

ROSSVILLE—Local voters may decide in November if Rossville-Alvin High School students will go to other schools.

At a special meeting Monday, the board voted to move forward with deactivating the district high school, allowing its students to attend Hoopeston Area or Bismarck-Henning high schools.

The action is contingent upon acceptance by Bismarck-Henning and Hoopeston Area and is being done with an eye towards forming a cooperative high school with all three districts when the state provides incentives for such schools, said board member Roger Satterwhite, who made the motion to deactivate.

The action came after board members set goals and reviewed eight methods of school reorganization. The goals included keeping the district grade school open, maintaining local control, utilizing the high school building, no tax increases, improving educational and extra-curricular offerings and looking out for district staff.

Of the eight reorganization choices, the board agreed that three - deactivation, a cooperative high school and conversion from a dual district to dual districts for the

high and grade school, appeared to meet most of the goals.

Of those, board members agreed that it was unlikely either Hoopeston Area or Bismarck-Henning would agree to form dual districts. Also, Superintendent Carl Sartwell said the tax rate for a dual district would be somewhat higher for some taxpayers.

As for the cooperative high school, that form of reorganization has never been done in the state and there are no state financial incentives for the method, which must be done for a minimum of 20 years.

Deactivation carries no incentives either, because the state considers it a stopgap measure until a permanent form of reorganization is approved.

Despite the lack of incentives, deactivation will provide what the district wants - for now. With a nod from the other districts, the board will put a referendum on the November ballot.

The board does not anticipate problems with district accepting students. Hoopeston Area board president Larry Lobb, who attended the meeting, said HA is

A simple majority of Rossville-Alvin voters is needed to pass the referendum, which will then allow parents to choose which high school their children will attend. The district will then pay tuition to receiving districts. Teachers will move to receiving districts in the same percentages as student attendance.

Prior to the vote, other options were discussed, such as raising the district tax rate by \$1. Board member Eric Roberts said the tax hike would raise an additional \$300,000, enough to help the district say afloat for about two years. "But that wouldn't do us any good," he said. "It's not worth burdening the taxpayers. Besides, it wouldn't pass anyway," he said.

The vote was unanimous but member Craig
