Hoopeston Area board turns down request to use Jerky

A request to use the Cornjerker mascot on a billboard in Hoopeston was turned down by the school board Thursday.

Two Hoopeston Area students, Josh Friant and Mike Farrell, had asked permission to use the Jerky on a billboard.

The students, who work at Hoopeston Books and Gifts, were asked by business owner Ed Hubbard to create a billboard of things they love about Hoopeston. The project began about two and a half months ago, Hubbard said.

In support of using Jerky, Jeff Keith, also of

Hoopeston Books and Gifts, said he felt the students were trying to educate people who come to town about the unique mascot, which, he said, could be used as a marketing tool to help the district's finances.

The board, however, voted to retain control on the copyrighted symbol. "If we ever start letting individuals use it, I don't know where we'd stop," said board president Larry Lobb. "How would you close the door?"

The board voted 6-0 to disallow use of the Jerky. Member Duane Sheppard abstained and, after the meeting, said he had "mixed emotions on it. I can see
