Hoopeston budget funds employee raises, has surplus

Hoopeston employees will get a 2.75 percent raise in a budget that has a surplus of nearly \$43,000.

The Hoopeston City Council unanimously approved the 2004 budget with income of \$1.8 million and normal expenses of \$1.57 million. Other one-time expenses and accruals for major purchases leaves the budget in the black by \$42,896, up from a \$777 surplus last year, said Alderman Bill Goodwine, city finance committee chairman.

The raise means city workers will receive, on average, about 35.5 cents per hour more, including a 20 cent raise given earlier this year and an extra holiday, Goodwine said.

In other action, the council received a petition with 120 signatures presented by Kathleen Margevich of the Academy for the Performing Arts. Signers of the petition are "begging you to swiftly ban dogs on Main St., not wait a million years," Margevich said.

Alderman Ed Lotz, chairman of the police committee, said police are addressing concerns of merchants. Foot patrols have been initiated in the downtown, and an additional four hours of patrol will be done each week with times rotated throughout the day. Also, Police Chief Mark Drollinger will review ordinances from other communities that have banned dogs in the business districts and will make a recommendation to the council about a similar ordinance here, he said.

In other business, the council approved a contract with Tax Increment Financing consultant Tom Jacobs & Associates for \$30,000 to oversee two new TIFs. Jacobs will also receive about 10 percent of the tax increment for three years.

Rossville-Alvin to host meeting with B-H, HA boards

ROSSVILLE-Rossville-Alvin school officials will host an informal meeting Thursday with school boards from Bismarck-Henning and Hoopeston Area.

The meeting will be a brainstorming session on Rossville-Alvin's plan to deactivate its high school and the ramifications of that decision, said RA Superintendent Carl Sartwell. "Really, we just want to get together and ask questions, not necessarily answer them," he said.

The meeting will be a springboard for the Rossville-Alvin board to develop a plan for students and staff and one for the public, to educate them on the reasons for the proposed deactivation, he said.

The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the grade school library and is open to the public.

accepted math teacher Mike Henry's resignation. Henry is retiring after 32 years as a teacher.

hired Karla Ballengee as high school cheer-• leading coach and Debra Goodlove as a personal special education aide for the rest of the year.

increased the driver's education fee from \$30 to \$50 next year.

approved a \$1,845 bid from XCel Mechanical for summer boiler work and a \$1,594 bid from CMI for high school and grade school gym refinishing

approved a \$1,000 stipend to the RA Beta Club. The group won state competition and will travel to Atlanta during the summer for a national competition.


