Schools question teacher shuffle, changing student counts

ROSSVILLE—How teachers will be divided between school districts and whether students will be allowed to change their minds about which school they will attend are prime concerns of officials of receiving schools should Rossville-Alvin deactivate its high school.

The boards of Rossville-Alvin, Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning met informally Thursday to discuss questions concerning the Rossville board's proposal to deactivate its high school. The board hopes to get a referendum on the November election and, if it passes, pay tuition for its students to attend at the other two schools. Rossville-Alvin officials eventually hope to have a cooperative high school with campuses in Hoopeston and Bismarck with its own high school used as a vocational center with distance learning classed and possibly technology classes.

Superintendents of Bismarck-Henning and Hoopeston Area questioned whether students will be allowed to change their minds about which schools they attend and how that will affect each district's staffing should students change their minds.

Rossville-Alvin's high school teachers will be divided between the other districts at the same percentage as student attendance.

According to some literature, there are options that the districts must agree on regarding student attendance. Changing one a year, every two years or not at all are options, said Dennis Price, Rossville-Alvin board president

Another question that must be researched is whether students who do opt for a different school will have to sit out one year of IHSA eligibility. IHSA rules state a student who does not change his physical address must have one year of ineligibility, said R-A Superintendent Carl Sartwell.

Another question arose about how soon students

would have to decide where they will attend. The vote would not happen until November and districts must notify by March teachers who will be cut. "I think it's a tight schedule this first year," said HA Superintendent Mark Conolly.

Conolly asked how Rossville-Alvin will handle bumping of its teachers. For example, he asked, will a high school teacher who has higher seniority and is certified as a high school and grade school educator be allowed to bump a grade school teacher with less seniority? "How the bumping is orchestrated is key to making this go smoothly," he said.

Another question is how R-A will handle three teachers who currently teach both high school and junior high school classes.

Roger Satterwhite, a Rossville board member, asked if either Bismarck-Henning or Hoopeston is interested in using the Rossville building.

Randy Hurd, Bismark-Henning superintendent, said using the building "is a real possibility" for some classes. He suggested starting as an educational center, not a vocational one. All the districts might be abl to share the costs of programs that none can offer independently. "We're trying to see the silver lining in this cloud," he said.

Conolly said he, Hurd and Sartwell are "strongly arguing" for a north Vermilion County VOTEC campus at Rossville. "It's on the table," he said.

The boards also discussed holding open houses at Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning to allow parents to see each campus prior to a November vote. "We've spent a lot of time on this and know what each district has to offer but the only way for people to know is to go see for themselves," Price said.

The boards will meet again after questions are researched and answers available. A date was not set.


