

### Foster home founder dies during weekend camping trip

A man who started a foster home in Hoopeston died during a Memorial Day weekend camping trip.

Doug Swisher, 48, of Hoopeston, died Sunday, said his son, Sidney Anderson Swisher.

Mr. Swisher was on a camping trip at Middlefork River Forest Preserve near Penfield when he stopped breathing. He walked to the ambulance and died en route to a hospital, Sidney Swisher said.

The cause of death is unknown pending results of an autopsy which was performed Tuesday, Sidney Swisher said. "Doug had a bad habit of pulling his own teeth," he said, speculating that Swisher may have had and infection or perhaps an allergic reaction.

A spokesman for the Champaign County Coroner's office said results of the inquest are not being released pending further investigation.

Sidney Swisher and his brother, Keith, both whom Mr. Swisher adopted, are working on funeral arrangements. Mr. Swisher had no life insurance, Sidney Swisher said.

Mr. Swisher opened Ultimate Care for Youth, a live-in foster care home for boys, in August 2001. The home, at 309 S. Market, cared for boys ages eight to 18. What will become of the home now will be up to Mr. Swisher's partner, Larry Dowler of Hoopeston.

Neither Dowler nor the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services' office of communications immediately returned phone calls seeking comment on the home.

There have been no foster children at the home for approximately the last four months, Sidney Swisher said.


