Health department officials find crow with West Nile virus

A dead crow found in Vermilion County has tested positive for West Nile Virus.

The crow was collected in Danville on June 7 and was tested at the University of Illinois School of Veterinary Medicine at Champaign-Urbana, according to an Illinois Department of Public Health press release.

"This is our first confirmation of the year that the virus is here in Vermilion County," said Kolby Riggle, Vermilion County Health Department Environmental

Health Director. "And we will continue to track movement of the virus through birds and mosquitoes."

Riggle said the health department is requesting that when the public finds a dead crow or blue jay they call the environmental health division at (217) 431-2662. ext. 243. If the bird has no evidence of being killed by another animal and is not decomposed, staff will pick the bird up to be tested.

In addition to testing crows and blue jays, the county is also using gravid traps to check for Culex mosquito pools. So far, none of the mosquitoes trapped have tested positive for West Nile Virus, Riggle said.

Traps are being rotated weekly around the county and monitored closely to determine the presence of the virus in mosquitoes. Grant money is funding placement of the traps, he said.

A total of 12 birds have been confirmed positive for West Nile Virus in Illinois since surveillance for the mosquito-borne disease began May 1. No human cases have been reported.

In 2003, 75 of the state's 102 counties had a West Nile positive bird, mosquito, horse or human. Last year, 54 human cases, including one fatality, were reported. In 2002, Illinois led the nation with 884 human cases and 66 deaths, according to the IDPH release.

The virus is transmitted through the bite of a mosquito that has picked up the virus by feeding on an infected bird. Most people with the virus have no symptoms but

may become ill three to 14 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito.

Ifections can be mild and include fever, headache and body aches or can be severe and marked by headache, high fever, neck stiffness, stupor, convulsions, muscle weakness, paralysis and, rarely, death. Serious West Nile virus illness is most often present in people 50 years of age or older.

To reduce the risk of West Nile disease, the IDPH recommends the following precautions:

- avoid being outdoors when mosquitoes are most active, especially between dusk and dawn.
- when outdoors, wear shoes and socks, long pants and long-sleeved shirts and apply insect repellent that includes DEET according to label instructions. Consult a physician before using repellents on young children.
- make sure doors and windows have tight-fitting screens. Repair or replace screens that have tears or other openings.
- eliminate all sources of standing water that can support mosquito breeding, including water in bird baths, ponds, flower pots, wading pools, old tires and any other receptacles.
