Stipp to move, resign from Hoopeston Area School Board

Hoopeston Area board member Jeff Stipp will resign from the board, effective at the July meeting.

Stipp made the announcement at Thursday's board meeting. "Sometimes life deals you a

hand you don't expect and you just go with the flow," Stipp said after

STIPP telling the board of his decision.

The Hoopeston native said he and his family will move to the Danville area to accommodate both his and his wife's careers.

Board president Larry Lobb expressed sorrow at Stipp's leaving. "You've been a very, very good board member," he said.

Superintendent Mark Conolly said the board has 30 days from Stipp's effective resignation date to appoint a replacement. If they do not, the regional superintendent will name one.

Whoever is chosen will face re-election in

April 2005 when Stipp's term ends. He was first elected to the board in November 1997.

In unrelated business, the board:

approved a contract with Isaksen-Glerum architectural firm of Champaign for a 10-year Life Safety study. Under the contract, for \$14,915, the company will review all buildings for work that needs to be done to comply with Life Safety codes.

accepted a bid from McMurray insurance for district insurance. The bid was \$64,121, about \$4,000 less than the next bid, Lobb said.

learned the district will again qualify for a • clean energy grant of up to \$18,916.

This is the second year the district has qualified for a full grant, which will be used to switch to more efficient light bulbs, said building administrator Darrell Brown.

heard from principals about changes in student • handbooks. The handbooks are expected to be approved at the July 15 meeting.

Florida man shoots trooper in Iroquois County, kills self

State Police investigating

A Florida man shot an Illinois State trooper trying to make a traffic stop, then later killed himself.

According to a press release from the Illinois State Police at Ashkum, the unidentified trooper was on patrol at about 8:30 p.m. Friday when he saw a Chevrolet El Camino run a stop sign at the intersection of U.S. Route 24 and Illinois 49 in Crescent City. The trooper turned on his emergency lights and the driver pulled over. As the trooper approached the vehicle, the driver got out and started firing a gun at

the trooper, hitting him in his bulletproof vest and hand. The trooper was taken to Carle Foundation Hospital. He was expected to be released Saturday.

The trooper apparently returned fire on the man, Michael Geary, 37, of Hobe Sound, Fla. Geary left the scene but was found about 12 miles away, on U.S. 24 and Illinois 115 in Piper City. Another trooper, assisted by the Ford County Sheriff's Department and Piper City police, stopped Geary again. It was then that he apparently shot and killed himself.


