ROSSVILLE—Village residents may pay more on their telephone bills to help Rossville's economy.

A six percent telecommunications tax will be considered at next month's meeting after trustees voted to table the issue Monday night.

Mayor Terry Prillaman suggested the extra tax as a

way to bring more money to the village. "It's an opportunity," he said. "God only knows we need the money, gentlemen and lady." If approved, the user fee will add six percent to the telephone bills of people with Rossville addressed. The tax will be on both land lines and cell phones. Prillaman estimated the tax could generate \$10,000 to \$12,000 for the general fund "and that's where we're hurting."

Unlike other municipalities which have added taxes to gas, water, electric and cable, Prillaman said he did not want to add taxes to those services. "We need cash but I don't see a reason to put it on everything," he said. "Telecommunication would be the one I think would be the least painful." Also, while the village could


