Meeting Thursday may decide fate of motel in Hoopeston

A meeting Thursday may provide an answer about whether a developer will build a motel in Hoopeston.

At Tuesday's city council meeting, Mayor Chalmers Flint said he will meet with the developer Thursday morning. "I'm hoping it will work out where we can get him to go ahead and build," Flint said.

Flint has worked with the unidentified man for two years trying to get him to commit to building a motel. Recently, the developer looked at four or five other communities as possible sites for a motel. The developer plans to build only one motel, Flint said previously.

In unrelated action, the council:

- approved an agreement with Rossville to sound the village's siren in the event of a tornado or other disaster. The agreement holds Hoopeston harmless in case of problems.
- approved a \$3,980 bid from Home Makers of Hoopeston to construct a sidewalk on East Orange. The walk will be about 309 feet long by four feet wide and will go from Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital to east of Euclid.

The issue was tabled last month.

- approved Robert Pratt and Randall Wallace as new auxiliary police officers.
- tabled a request to close Main Street for a

Rossville board fails to bring telecommunications tax to vote

ROSSVILLE—Village board members are willing to pass a six percent telecommunications tax if certain conditions are met but those conditions were not in place at Monday night's meeting.

The tax would be on all telephone and cell phone lines of village residents. Municipalities can set a rate of up to six percent, the amount suggested in Rossville. That rate would generage about \$15,000-\$20,000 annually.

Conditions vary by trustee. Richard Birkey suggested going into closed session to discuss ways to cut expenses while Mark Catron and Robert Merritt said they want to wait until Tax Increment Financing money starts coming in to see if the tax is needed. Kay Ritter favors it if money will go for special projects like sidewalk repair. Mike Clutter said he does not want the tax at all.

"Nobody wants it," said Mayor Terry Prillaman. "I think it's just a matter of being fiscally responsible." The idea of the tax, which was first suggested last month, is drawing mixed reviews among residents. Ritter said she spoke with about 15 people and 90 percent of those would support the tax. Resident Naomi Freeman said she spoke with other residents who would also support the increase. Catron said he has received negative feedback about it.

A tax for special projects may be the only way to get them done, Ritter said. General fund income is down, in part because of the February fire that destroyed several businesses. The fund has a deficit and while trustees hoped to have the deficit paid off next year, with income down, "I'm not sure it will be in the black next year," she said.

In support of the tax, Prillaman said he has been involved with the village for nearly 40 years "and I've never raised a tax." However, he added, the village is faced with declining revenue and he does not favor additional real estate taxes. Neighboring communitities have five precent taxes on all utilities, which Rossville
