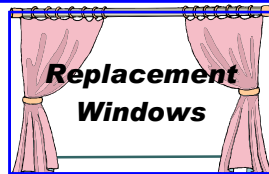

Golf outing to benefit brain tumor research, awareness

ROSSVILLE—The second annual Tim Bray Memorial golf outing hopes to raise more money for brain tumor awareness and cancer research.

Last year's maiden outing raised \$8,000 and resulted in the Tim Bray Memorial Fund at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis, Ind., to help cancer patients and their families, as well as help fund research into the disease.

This year's outing will be held Aug. 7 at Hubbard Trail Country Club. Shotgun scrambles will be held at 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Rain date is Aug. 8.

Cost is \$45 for those not members of Hubbard Trail, \$35 for members without carts and \$25 for members with carts. All proceeds will be donated to the memorial fund.

Additionally, hole and cart sponsorships are available for \$50 and \$25, respectively. Lunch will be served and is available for those who do not golf for \$7.

Mr. Bray died approximately two years ago, at age 34, of glioblastoma, a malignant brain tumor. Since then, family members have worked to establish the memorial fund in his honor to help cancer patients and their families, fund research and increase public awareness to brain tumors.

Statistics for brain tumors are staggering:

- More than 195,000 brain tumors are diagnosed in the United States and Canada each year. That is one new brain tumor every three minutes.

- There are more than 120 different types of brain tumors. Whether "benign" or "malignant," all can cause death or disability.

- Brain tumors are the leading cause of cancer
