Grant Township gardeners boost Food Cupboard supplies

Area gardeners are helping keep the Grant Township Food Cupboard supplied with fresh produce - and the timing couldn't be better.

Gardeners have taken a total of 539 pounds of produce to the Food Cupboard as part of the "Plant A Row" program, said township supervisor Bill Boose.

Bernie Chamberlain started the local effort two or three years ago and the program, like the gardens that supply it, has grown. This year's total to date is the largest in the local program's history, Boose said.

Under the program, gardeners donate their surplus produce - from apples to zucchini - to the food cupboard. Boose would like to see more gardeners participate, "especially if they're going to throw it away anyway. If we can't get rid of it, we'll pitch it," he said.

A new refrigerator, purchased with Cadle Foundation funds, is being used to store the produce, which is then given to food cupboard clients.

The produce is especially welcome because the

Illinois Food Bank has severely decreased the amount of food sent to the food cupboard. "When Carol and I first started about three and a half years ago, we got over 100 cases (of food)," Boose said. In the last few months, the food cupboard has received 12-15 cases each month, making the produce "very opportune," he said.

Anyone wishing to donate produce may take it the Grant Township office at 525 S. Market. Produce may be dropped off from 8 a.m.-noon and 1-4 p.m. or, for those who use their lunch hour, produce may be left by the door. "We'll take it at any time and any kind of fresh produce," Boose said.

Gardeners willing to donate a significant amount of produce may call Boose to have it picked up. He may be reached at 283-5221.

Plant a Row is a national program started in the United States in 1995. It was modeled on the Canadian "Grow A Row program which began in 1988 in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Governor signs legislation granting property tax relief

Gov. Rod Blagojevich has signed a new law increasing statewide homeowner exemptions and providing additional relief for senior citizens.

Effective immediately, the new law:

increases the statewide homeowner exemption to \$5,000, up from \$3,500. All Illinois property owners will be able to claim the increased exemption on their 2004 tax bills regardless of how much their property value increased.

assists senior citizens by increasing their additional homeowner exemption to \$3,000, up from \$2,000.

increase the income level for seniors to be eligible for an assessment freeze on their property. The current level is \$40,000. The new law increases it to \$45,000.

The homeowner and senior citizen exemptions will automatically become effective. Property owners will not have to sign up for them. Residents who were turned down for the assessment freeze due to income and whose household income is under the maximum may file a new application, said Grant Township Assessor Susie Sheppard. Forms are expected to be available this week at the assessor's office at 525 S. Market St.
