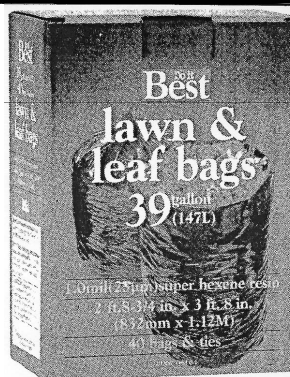

Council approves elected official pay hikes in short session

The Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved a resolution raising salaries for elected officials.

The meeting, which also including paying bills, was concluded in 12 minutes, said Mayor Chalmers Flint.

The resolution makes official action taken at the Aug. 17 meeting in which the council approved increasing salaries for incoming aldermen and the mayor and the Sept. 7 meeting in which clerk and treasurer salaries were increased.

Increases will take effect for officials elected next April. Those not up for reelection will receive their current salaries.

Under the resolution, the mayor's salary will go to \$750 per month or \$9,000 per year. The mayor now receives \$300 monthly.

Aldermen will receive \$125 per month, up from \$100.

The clerk and treasurer now receive \$200 monthly. That will increase to \$250 after the next election.

2004 Heart Walk to honor memory of Hoopeston boy

The 2004 American Heart Association Heart Walk will honor the memory of a Hoopeston boy who lost his battle with heart disease. Carter J. Wise of Hoopeston was only three years old when he died this year. "The sad thing for his family is that Carter was only expected to survive a few minutes after he was born, said Cheri Hillier of the Heart Association. "Yet Carter's family was blessed to have him for three years - in part because of the research that has gone into heart surgery she said. "The three heart surgeries Carter underwent were successful and his heart was strong when he died."

Hillier said Carter's father, Jeff Wise, said Carter developed Reyes Syndrome following a bout with the flu, and died in January.

Heart Walk chairman Gary Hackler of Georgetown said walk organizers believe it is important to remember the valiant effort Carter Wise made to fight heart disease at such a young age. "Too often we think heart disease only affects older people," he said. "The reality is that heart disease can attach anyone at any age at any time."

Red hearts are for sale at various sites across the county until the day of the walk, Oct. 23. They are at Burger King (north location) Carmack Car Capitol, Lee's Famous Recipe, Garfield's Restaurant, CellOne, Big R and both Royal Donut locations in Danville.

The 2004 Vermilion County Heart Walk will be held on the grounds of the Illiana Medical Center on East Main Street, Danville. Funds raised will go toward heart research. Teams are being formed and information is available by called Mary Ellen Baer at (217) 431-2424.
