HA board starts education process on tax hike referendum

The Hoopeston Area school board kicked off an education campaign aimed at taxpaying adults.

At Thursday night's board meeting, information was presented on why the board has placed a referendum on the Nov. 2 ballot asking for a 90 cent increase in the education fund.

Russ Leigh was named chairman of a citizens committee to disseminate information to district voters about the requested hike, which, if passed, will raise the district tax rate from \$3.76 to \$4.66.

According to an information packet made available at the meeting, the board is asking for more money for the education fund because of increased expenses and shrinking income.

The district receives income from local, state and federal sources and has seen decreases in all three. For example, special education funding from the federal government is supposed to be at 40 percent. However, according to the packet, only 16 percent is now funded, leaving the district to pay 84 percent for the federally-mandated services.

On the state level, declining enrollment - a loss of 380 students since 1994 - has resulted in lost state aid of just under \$2 million each year. Additionally, the state also mandates programs but like the federal government, does not fully fund them, putting the burden on the district.

Locally, the district has lost money from the downsized economy and the closing of local industries and the equalized assessed valuation has stagnated for the last several years.

For the last several years, Hoopeston Area has used surplus funds to cover deficit budgets but those funds are expected to be depleted this year.

On the flip side, costs continue to rise, including salaries, books, insurance, utilities, health care and

others.

Over the last several years, the district has cut several positions and programs to make ends meet, including nearly 20 teaching positions, an administrator, assistant coaches and custodians. If the referendum fails, more cuts can be expected in sports offerings and other extra curricular programs, choral and band programs, electives, vocational courses and perhaps even closing an elementary building.

Hoopeston Area is not alone in its financial state. Approximately 70 percent of Illinois schools are in deficit spending. Hoopeston Area is on the state's Financial Review list and if finances decline further, it may go on the warning or watch list.

Hoopeston Area's last tax increase was in 1973. An intervening tax increase was not needed because the district consolidated with East Lynn, Wellington and Rankin. The industrial base also helped Hoopeston maintain its low tax rate.

The board estimates that the 90 cent increase could serve the district for as much as 10 years provided outside factors are favorable.

In other action, the board:

- approved the 2004-05 budget with an estimated \$537,000 deficit. The "worst case scenario" budget predicts revenue of \$8,956,000 and expenses of \$9,493,000.
- learned the six-day enrollment, used in determining state aid, showed a 10 student increase over last year. This is the first time since 1994-95 that the enrollment figure has not gone down but officials do not expect it to be a trend that continues.
- announced that the district will hold an open house for Rossville-Alvin High School students and parents at 7 p.m. Oct. 13. The event is being held to showcase Hoopeston Area to Rossville-Alvin students


