East Washington residents seek help with roaches, vermin

Some residents of the 700 block of East Washington want help from city officials in cleaning up their neighborhood.

Several citizens attended Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting to ask for help dealing with a family who, the residents said, have cars full of debris that are attracting rats and cockroaches.

The family moved to Hoopeston from Rankin early this year and includes an older woman, her son, his wife, three children and their three dogs. The family has eight vehicles parked on the property, including three that are used for storage. A pool on the property sits empty and has reportedly had the liner punctured.

Speaking for her fellow residents, Vickie Means said the Vermilion County Health Department is working on the issue but the representative suggested city ordinances might be more useful in solving the problem.

Means' husband, James, said the problem is a townwide joke. "Everywhere I go, people say 'what's going on next door," he said.

Another resident said the situation is compared to having the Beverly Hillbillies in the neighborhood. "It does get old," he said.

One problem is that all vehicles are licensed and cannot be considered abandoned or junk vehicles, said Hoopeston Police Sgt. James Goodrum, adding the department is aware of the situation.

Zoning administrator Tom Bookwalter is expected to review existing ordinances and the council may look at creating a new ordinance to address the problem.

U of I trumpet instructor, students teach local grade schoolers

On November 18, 15 trumpet players from the University of Illinois and their instructor, Dr. Michael Ewald arrived in Hoopeston. They played two assembly programs at Honeywell and John Greer schools. Reese Land, a graduate student in the ensemble, organized and conducted the assemblies with a clinic session between to instruct John Greer trumpet players. John Greer students then played a harmonized version of "O Come All Ye Faithful" with the college students at the assembly and were "inducted" as official members of the Trumpet Studio at the University of Illinois.

The assemblies featured music in the classical style mixed with the finale Latin style of "Tico Tico". Each piece highlighted different aspects of musical performance including dynamics, tempo, and imitation. Land also talked of the history of the trumpet and showed a variety of trumpets including the pic-
