

ROSSVILLE—Rossville-Alvin's financial outlook will be a little brighter by the end of February.

At Monday's meeting, the district school board approved issuing \$300,000 in Working Cash bonds. The bonds will be issued as \$200,000 in type A bonds which are taxable and \$100,000 type B bonds which are not taxable, said consultant Kevin Hyde. First National Bank of Odgen will be the bond registrar.

The type A bonds will be used to pay down the district's education fund debt, estimated at a Jan. 6 public hearing at \$352,905, said Superintendent Carl Sartwell.


The \$100,000 in type B bonds will be used for

capital improvements, including repairing the grade school roof, parking lot repairs and a zoned heating system for the high school to increase efficiency, Sartwell said.

Bonds had been expected to be issued Feb. 1 but since the board meeting was later than usual, will be available at the end of the month.

Some of the money not immediately used may be invested in the state's liquid asset fund. The board approved joining the program, which carries no fees until investments are made. Sartwell said he will continue to investigate the asset program to compare See ROSSVILLE on other side
