



Joint Review Board approves two new tax increment areas

Representatives of taxing bodies in Hoopeston approved the city's plan to form two new Tax Increment Financing areas in the city.

Mark Conolly, superintendent of Hoopeston Area schools, Lou Graham of the Hoopeston Public Library, Bill Boose, Grant Township supervisor, Mayor Chalmers Flint and Alderman John Haughee, designated to represent the public, met Friday with TIF consultant Dan Walker of Jacob & Associates and Tom Lowe of development company Gallagher Commercial at a Joint Review Board meeting to review the new districts.

The new districts are being taken from parcels in the original TIF district formed in 1999, Walker said. TIF 2 includes the new CVS and former Baer's Trailer Court slated for commercial development. "We're looking to get a motel out there but don't know if that will happen," Walker said. Other plans include a restaurant and more commercial development.

TIF 3 is currently farmland east of Euclid owned by Larry Petrie that is proposed for residential development.

The new districts solve boundary problems associated with the original TIF district, Walker said. While the original TIF could have been amended to fix the problems but the clock would have been running on its 23year lifespan. The new districts will each last up to 23 years, he said.

Walker praised Grant Township Assessor Susie Sheppard for her role in getting the boundaries ironed out. "She's always been right there for us," he said. "Susie has really helped straighten it out."

Walker explained that TIF 3 is expected to be especially helpful to Hoopeston Area schools both because developers hope to attract families with children to attend the school and also because Illinois statutes added since the original TIF was formed require schools to be taken into consideration when TIFs are formed.

In Tax Increment Financing areas, a base year of property taxes is established. Taxing bodies continue to receive property taxes in the amount of the base year but subsequent increases, resulting from development or other reasons, are put in a special city TIF fund. That money is used to reimburse eligible TIF-related expenses and can be used for capital improvements on structures of other taxing bodies or special projects. Money from the city's TIF fun has already been given to the school district for a new roof and for things like Project Playground 2002 which put new playground equipment at McFerren Park.

Old TIF guidelines did not make special allowances for school districts but new rules for residential TIFs ignore increases in equalized assessed valuation in planning school state aid. "Theoretically, you're not losing that state aid that goes along with EAV," Walker said, adding there is a maximum cap of 25 percent of TIF funds that may go to the school district.

The board reviewed the history of the original TIF and its role in constructing the new CVS Pharmacy. Project developer Lowe talked about problems with the project, including working out an agreement with the Baer family and doing environmental studies on the property that showed the presence of asbestos in existing structures and soil contamination from underground gasoline storage tanks that had been removed.

Because the city received a Brownfields grant and agreed to incentives, the project was able to move forward, Flint said.

The total area of the city in TIF districts is somewhat smaller than the original TIF because three areas were removed. They include old railroad right of way not in the city limits, homes near the Petrie property and the area surrounding the city slab.
