







**Discovery recount scheduled in Hoopeston mayor's race** A mayoral candidate has requested a discovery recount regarding the April 5 mayor's race in

Hoopeston. On Friday, candidate Lourdine Florek filed for a discovery recount with the Vermilion County

Clerk's office. Florek was six votes behind the winning candidate. Bill DeWitt, who will be sworn in as mayor at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Florek said she requested the recount because of discrepancies in vote totals in one of the local precincts. Grant 4 reportedly had 191 affidavits and 191 ballots but at the close of voting, the tape printed by the voting machine had a total of 193 votes cast for mayor.

"It has been suggested by some voting officials that either two extra ballots were handed out to

# Hoopeston Area teacher to stand trial for counterfeiting

A Hoopeston Area High School teacher is scheduled to appear in Vermilion County Circuit Court on Aug. 22 on charges that she, and two students, forged counterfeit money.

Kelley C. Goodrum, 37, was charged with forgery for creating a counterfeit\$50 bill on Feb. 28.

At Goodrum's preliminary hearing Thursday, Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger testified that Goodrum allegedly said she watched and assisted as some of her students make the fake money in her classroom.

Drollinger testified that the police department received a counterfeit \$5 bill and an anonymous tip that equipment in Goodrum's classroom was used to make the money. He further said one of

In the discovery recount, the votes of 25 percent of the total precincts in the jurisdiction may be recounted. Florek has requested that Grant 2 and Grant 4 be redone.

The recount will be held at 9 a.m. May 9 in the Vermilion County Courthouse Annex. There, the ballots in the two precincts will be examined and recounted and the voting machine tested.

The discovery recount does not change the results of the election. To do that, an election contest would have to be filed with the Vermilion County Circuit Court. A judge would hear evidence and could, if warranted, void the vote totals and order a

Goodrum's students allegedly said that, using a photocopier, they reproduced both sides of \$5 and \$50 bills, cut them out and glued them together. The student alleged that Goodrum watched and helped them cut out the money.

In further testimony, Drollinger said Goodrum at first denied any knowledge of the activity but that in a subsequent phone conversation, she admitted that she watched and helped but that it was part of a joke.

However, Drollinger testified, one \$50 bill was given to another person as currency. Other phony bills were found outside a Hoopeston business.

Goodrum, who was hired at Hoopeston
