Hoopeston City Council looks at restoring pond maintenance

The goldfish may have gotten a reprieve.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Alderman Ed Lotz said the city hopes to work with pond developer Jack Miller on an affordable price for maintaining the pond at Floral Hill Cemetery.

Last month, the council announced it cut an estimated \$9,000, earmarked for pond maintenance, from the budget. The cut "doesn't mean we're actually going to fill in the pond," Lotz said.

were DeWitt, city clerk Louise Barten, treasurer Edye Bookwalter and council members Gail Lane, Crusinberry and Bill Goodwine. Aldermen unanimously approved Jerry Yonkers to fill the unexpired term of John Haughee, who resigned. He will be sworn in May 17.

The council approved a salary range ordinance covering pay for employees and elected officials. DeWitt and newly-elected aldermen will get an increase from their predecessors, with DeWitt receiving \$750 per month, up from \$300. Aldermen will receive \$125 monthly, up from \$100.

In passing the ordinance, the council approved dropping an attendance requirement. Aldermen who missed more than four meetings were not paid for missed meetings but Alderman Brandon Hamilton called the restriction "unfair" and suggested it be stricken. Goodwine was the sole "no" vote on the issue.
