Lourdine Florek, who lost to new Mayor Bill DeWitt by six votes, requested recounts of Grant 2 and Grant 4, specifically because the number of ballots in Grant 4 was two less than the total number of mayor votes tallied by the voting machine at the end of the night.

Monday's recount showed two voters received ballots for the city election when they should not have.

"I'm happy that we have an answer to the discrepancy.
