When Bob Ault was running for mayor he asked me what I thought the city could improve on. The cemetery issue was my only complaint.

I strongly believe that our cemeteries are as sacred as our churches. Some people go to the cemetery to be with their loved ones and to offer prayers. I know this for a fact because I have experienced it. When my son drowned in 1977, I had him buried at Floral Hill. After his death I spent several Sunday mornings going to the cemetery to be with him just to talk with him and to pray.

I wasn't alone. You would be surprised at the number of Hoopeston citizens that made that trek on Sunday mornings. Some would bring water cans and water their plants that had been placed on the gravesites with love and care. Others would bring scissors and trim grass around the grave sites. Some would pick up trash or dead flowers and carry to the trash bins. It was a beautiful thing to watch these people as they went about showing their love and tenderness
