Hoopeston police seek help in finding local battery suspect

The Hoopeston Police Department is asking for the public's assistance in locating Robert S. (Bobby) Akers in connection with an incident at 8:50 p.m. Sunday.

Akers is wanted on charged of aggravated battery and escape after he allegedly struck an unidentified 26-year-old Hoopeston man in the head with a machete. Akers was taken into custody and escaped while handcuffed.

The victim was airlifted to Carle Foundation

Hospital, Urbana, and was listed in fair condition Monday morning, said Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger.

Drollinger said the men allegedly had an argument at a residence in the 300 block of West Maple and, after the incident, Akers left the scene and was later arrested, then escaped. Several people have called the department with information and police are following all leads, he said.

Akers is described as 6' , 160 lbs., with brown

Hoopeston Fire Department welcomes new vehicle to fleet

A much-anticipated fire truck was delivered to the Hoopeston Fire Department Saturday.

The 1994-95 Darley rescue pumper truck was purchased last year, along with a tanker. The department received the tanker but had to wait on the pumper until original owners, the Bourbonnais Fire Department, received its replacement.

The newest addition to the fire department fleet includes a 500-gallon water storage tank, 30-gallon foam tank and will carry the department's extrication and air tank refilling systems. "If we go to a wreck, we can do it all (with one truck)," said fireman Ross Johnson.

An on-board generator runs the truck's hydraulics and four telescoping lights, each 300 watts, will help light night fire scenes.

The city paid \$150,000 for the used trucks, significantly less than one new truck would cost, said Fire Chief Greg Shipman.

Shipman said the department priced a new rescue truck at more than \$200,000 without

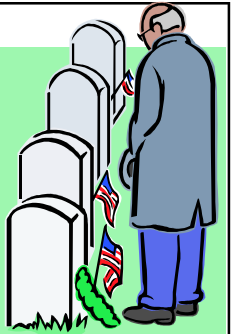

still in handcuffs. Anyone making contact with him should not confront him but should call police immediately at 9-1-1 or 283-5196.

This is not Akers’ first run-in with the legal system. In 1996, he pleaded guilty to one county of aggravated battery and was sentenced to 30 months’ probation. Probation was later revoked and he was sentenced to four years in the Illinois Department of Corrections.
