Vermilion County State's Attorney Frank 70-Young may decide this week whether to file a 60murder charge against a Hoopeston man. 50-Robert S. "Bobby" Akers, 26, may face the charge in connection with a May 22 incident in which he allegedly

Mr. Brougher, 26, died at noon Thursday at Carle Foundation Hospital, Urbana.

Akers was arrested after the incident, but escaped and was apprehended the next evening, still in handcuffs, by two citizens in Wellington.

Akers was charged with aggravated battery and escape and is being held in the Public Safety Building on \$500,000 (10%) bond.

What new charges may be filed against Akers will depend on autopsy reports and the exact cause of death, Young said.

Complete results could take as long as four weeks, said a spokesperson from the Champaign County Coroner's office.

Mr. Brougher was airlifted to Carle in fair condition and was placed in intensive care immediately after the incident. He had reportedly been transferred from ICU because his condition had improved prior to his death.

Depending on autopsy results, Akers could face attempted murder or murder charges. "All the options are still open," Young said.

No matter what charges he faces, Hoopeston Police Chief Mark Drollinger said their information will be ready. The department's role "changed very little" with Mr. Brougher's death. "The case was prepared from the beginning as if it was going to be a potential

capital case," he said. As officials ponder

Akers' fate, Iroquois County officials are looking into allegations he has made that he was attacked by at least one of the men who brought him in.

According to Lt. Randy Eimen of the Iroquois County Sheriff's Department, Akers is alleging that he was hit in the face with a board.

Akers' most recent mug shot shows him with a neck brace and swollen nose.

Eimen said he interviewed Akers at the Public Safety Building last week, talked to people in the general area the night Akers was found and collected evidence at the scene. This week, he plans to talk to the citizens who brought Akers in.

The board found at the scene does have blood on it but Eimen said the blood pattern seems to be drops that fell from someone standing or kneeling above it. "It doesn't' appear to be from an impact," he said. "That would be a different pattern."

Additionally, Eimen said, one witness at the scene reported that Akers lunged at his captors and that the See CHARGE on other side
