Rossville puts on the dog...er, ducks for Drivin' the Dixie

ROSSVILLE—Rossville is turning to the Dixie and Ducks for a new annual event. Drivin' the Dixie Days, promoting the historic Dixie Highway, will take place June 18-19.

The two-day long event is part of a coordinated 13-community celebration that will include a 120-mile vintage car tour of the historic roadway. Each community along the route will have its own special activities taking place. Anyone with an antique car or who just wants to drive the historic roadway is encouraged to do so.

The Rossville Community Organization, which is coordinating the event in Rossville, has expanded their celebration into two days worth of fun. There will be an antique tractor show and parade, a downtown merchant sidewalk sale and a community wide garage sale.

The Highway 341 Band from Wallace, Ind. will be performing at variety of country, country rock and gospel from 11a.m. to 1p.m. Saturday at the park's Cadle Pavilion.

For the grand finale, Ross-ville is turning to ducks. Not live ducks, but cute little rubber ones that will make the opening splash in the first annual Dixie Duck Dash down a section of the North Fork of the Vermilion River. The first five ducks over the finish line will be awarded cash prizes. For those wanting to participate, the RCO is offering two options. One can rent a generic

duck for \$5 or adopt a designer duck for \$10. More than 50 types of designer ducks are available ranging from Graduation Duck to Grandma Duck.
