

## City to take possession of Baer's Trailer Park, cleanup set

Hoopeston officials are expected to take possession Wednesday of the former Baer's Trailer Park at Rtes. 1 and 9.

Mayor Bill DeWitt made the announcement at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

The city agreed pay \$125,000 for the property, which was assessed at twice the amount.

Once the city owns the estimated 6.24 acres and cleans it up, it is expected to turn over approximately two acres to Bhupendra Naik, owner of two Best Western motels in Danville. He plans to build a 22-room motel on the site. In April, Naik estimated the cost of building the motel at \$500,000.

Naik will be eligible for reimbursement of up to 70 percent of allowed costs because the property is in one of Hoopeston's three tax increment financing districts.

In related business Tuesday, the council heard from Eric Brumbaugh of Shaw Environmental on the brownfields grant program.

Hoopeston received \$96,413 from the state to do environmental testing of soil and ground water and proposed remediation at the trailer park, the former Carnival Video building and Baer's Motel.

The city will request an additional \$38,000 from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to finalize remediation so that "no further remediation" letters may be issued for all the properties.

The letters will make it easier to sell the properties, Brumbaugh said, because as long as the condi-

For example, he explained, asphalt at the former Carnival Video store serves as a buffer to petroleum that might have leaked from when the site was a gas station. As long as the asphalt remains and is kept in good shape, property owners will not have to have the soil removed and new soil put in. Low levels of petroleum were found at that site and traces of lead were found at the trailer park.

Brumbaugh said he met with IEPA officials, reviewed his proposed remediation plan and "got a warm, fuzzy feeling from the state."

In unrelated action, the council:

- approved a \$6,400 bid from Mike's Painting to paint the meeting room, kitchen and restroom areas of the civic center.
- approved a \$117,000 bid from Ribbe Trucking of Bismarck for Motor Fuel Tax repairs. A \$13,541 bid, also from Ribbe, was accepted for repairs to landfill road. Repairs will be paid by the city with money the landfill pays to the city for hosting and other fees.
- approved a five-year extension to the ERH Enterprises contract. The addition becomes effective when the current contract expires in two years, said Alderman Bill Crusinberry. The extension calls for an eight percent increase. Last year, the city paid \$252,000 to ERH, which pays all related expenses, including repairs and salaries, of managing the wastewater treatment plant.
- approved joining the Illinois Municipal League, which provides insurance coverage for liability, Workmen's Compensation and others. The cost is will be determined on the city's loss experience, said Alderman Bill Goodwine. Last year the city paid about \$90,000.
