Hoopeston Area staves off projected 04-05 \$500,000 deficit

Hoopeston Area school officials smiled Thursday night after learning the district did not have a projected half million dollar deficit.

The financial year ended June 30 with the district a total of \$92,000 in the black in all funds combined and with a \$195,000 deficit in the education fund, said Superintendent Mark Conolly at Thursday night's board meeting.

The deficit would have bee \$100,000 less but officials made early payments into the teachers' pension program for some educators who retired this year, he said.

"We came very, very, very close to a balanced budget," Conolly said of the real \$95,000 deficit, representing about one percent of the \$9 million total budget. "We're very happy about that."

Education fund expenses all came in under 100 percent while revenues exceeded projections. Officials had feared they would have to dip into Working Cash fund reserves but did not have to do so. "We're very pleased about where we ended up this year, considering where we were last year," Conolly told the board.

The board approved the possible use of Working Cash funds next year, if needed, because the issue must be approved before the money is needed. "This is less likely now than ever but I would feel more comfortable if we did this, Conolly told the board. "We've never had to dip into it and I hope we never do."

The Working Cash fund is not expected to be needed next year because of the 90 cent tax referendum ap-
