Hoopeston, Westville flu shot clinics delayed...once again

Flu shot clinics for Vermilion County residents are being pushed back following a delay in vaccine shipment. "We were told the vaccine would arrive (last) week," said Vermilion County Health Department Administrator Steve Laker. However the vaccine manufacturer experienced difficulty meeting its shipping deadlines. "In no way does this mean we will not receive sufficient vaccine to complete our planned flu clinics." Laker said, "but unfortunately it does force us to push clinics back later into November".

Flu clinics scheduled for Monday in Hoopeston and in Westville on Tuesday are being rescheduled. When the vaccine arrives from the manufacturer, a flu shot clinic is planned for Hoopeston on Tuesday November 15 from 9 am to 1 pm at the Hoopeston Methodist Church. Westville's flu shot clinic will be moved to Wednesday November 16 from noon to 4 pm at the Church of Christ in Westville. Both flu shot clinics will be open to high risk and the general public, regardless of health status.

With a sufficient supply of vaccine on hand, the health department will reschedule its flu clinics for the general public at its Danville facility, 200 South College Street, on Friday November 18 and Monday November 21. Both will be from 9 am to 6 pm. Additional flu shot clinics will be scheduled, if there is sufficient vaccine.

"We appreciate how frustrated the public must feel by the changes we have had to make," Laker said, "because we are also frustrated." "We are doing everything in our power to ensure the county receives sufficient vaccine, as soon as possible," he adds.

The health department gave 2,400 shots during four high risk clinics last week, depleting their vaccine supply, and forcing them to delay future clinics until additional vaccine arrives.

Safety tips listed for Halloween trick-or-treaters, adults

Trick or Treat hours

Little ghosts and goblins will be out in force tonight, trick-ortreating in local neighborhoods. To make the experience a fun,

safe one, parents and youngsters are urged _ to follow these safety precautions: •Carry a bright flashlight to illuminate sidewalks, steps and paths. Use fresh flashlight batteries. Check it before you leave the house. Chemical glow in the dark light sticks can be used along with flashlights. •Walk, don't run, to avoid slips and falls. •Stay on the Sidewalks. If their is no sidewalk, walk on the left side of the road. Walk facing traffic. •Obey traffic signals.

•Cross only at corners, with adults.

•Do not wear and use rollerblades to go out trick-or-treating. •Do not assume you have the right of way. If one car stops, it doesn't mean others will. •Trick-or-Treat only in familiar neighborhoods.

> •Do not cut across strangers yards or driveways. Trip on hoses, rakes.

•Wear a watch you can read in the dark. •Make sure your costumes don't drag on the ground.

•Wear comfortable walking shoes that fit properly. Make sure shoe laces are tied tight.

•Avoid wearing your mask while walking from house to house.

•Carry only flexible knives, swords or other props.

•Avoid pointed props such as spears, or wands that endanger other children's eyes.

•Wear clothing and costumes with reflective tape or "Glow in the Dark" markings.

•Visit houses that have lights on, especially houses with Halloween decorations.

•Always use the front door. Never go to the back of a house. •Stay away from any animals that you don't know.

Always carry a spare Halloween bag just in case yours breaks.Always be polite. And don't forget to say "Thank You".

For adults

•Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, garden hoses, dog leashes and low flower pots. These objects can trip the young trick-or-treater.

•Be sure the path and stairs to your front door are well illuminated and clear of obstacles. Double check all the outside lights...!!!

•Pets get frightened on Halloween. Put them in a kennel to protect them from cars or inadvertently biting a trick-or-treater. •Glow light sticks or battery powered jack-o-lantern light are preferable to real flame candles.

•If you do use candles, place the carved jack-o-lantern away
