## Newport Depot on schedule disposing of VX nerve agent

The Newport, (Ind.) Chemical Agent Disposal Facility has begun the task of destroying VX, a chemical nerve agent developed in the 1960s.

Susan Gilman, outreach office manager at the Newport Chemical Depot, was the featured speaker at Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting.

VX is erroneously called a nerve gas. Instead, it is a liquid substance with the consistency of motor oil or Karo syrup, Gilman said.

The chemical was originally created to be infused into

land mines or sprayed in areas in times of war. However, Gilman said, "from what we've been told, the U.S. never used VX in combat."

The International Chemical Weapons Convention banned the use of nerve agents and requires stockpiles to be destroyed by 2007. The only facility that manufactured the nerve agent is now in charge of destroying it.

Gilman said an estimated 1,000 tons of the chemical is to be destroyed as part of the multi-national chemical weapons ban. To date, 55,356 pounds have been destroyed. "We've got a ways to go," she said.

Thus far, only small batches of VX have been destroyed as the process is fine-tuned.

Approximately 1,000 employees at the depot are involved in neutralizing the chemical.

The first step is to add hot sodium hydroxide and water to VX. The process created a byproduct, caustic wastewater, which also must be disposed of carefully. Currently, the Army is working with a DuPont wastewater treatment plant in New Jersey to treat the caustic wastewater. An agreement has not been reached pending outcome of Centers for Disease Control studies, Gilman said.



#### VX continued from other side

Last weekend, the Newport plant shut down after wastewater leaked when a gasket failed to seal properly. The problem was fixed and the plant is once again neutralizing VX, Gilman said.

The second step is cleansing the storage tanks. Each is rinsed three times, then circulated with hot air. A borescope is used to check for residue. Electric coils are then inserted into each container and heated to 1000 degrees for 15 minutes. When cleaned, the containers may be recycled, she said.

VX is a particularly deadly nerve agent and is odorless and tasteless. "I've talked to people who have actually smelled it and they said it is odorless," Gilman said. "I've never talked to anyone who's actually tasted it."

It has been reported that the plant contains enough VX to kill everyone in Indiana which, Gilman said, is true but unlikely. "You'd have to line everybody up and give them a drop of VX," she said.

#### an antidote, as is bleach.

The Newport Chemical Depot was built in the 1940s as the Wabash River Ordnance Works. Along with VX, the plant has also produced TNT.

The 7,000 acre complex includes about 3,000 acres of farm ground and 2,000 acres of standing timber. The depot tries to be a good steward of the land and has introduced some native grasses to part of the complex, replacing those destroyed when the depot was built.

Gilman said work at the depot is also affected by the Indiana brown bat, which is on the endangered species list and likes to make its home in trees near the site.
