## City bears cost of repairing Market; approves road projects

It will be up to the city of Hoopeston to bear the cost of repairing a bad patch of Market St. by Maple.

At Tuesday night's regular city council meeting, Street and Alley Superintendent Dave Knake said the city will have to pay the expense. "The state let the contractor off the hook, so we're stuck with it," he said.

The new pavement is buckling in the area. Knake hoped Iroquois Paving, who did the work, would have to repair the spot.

In related action, the council approved 2006 Motor Fuel Tax street repairs, estimated at about \$174,000. The

The Seventh St. project will include curbing and sidewalk ramps, said Ellen Hedrick of Sodeman & Associates, the city's engineering firm.

In other action, the council approved writing off \$15,000 of a \$35,000 revolving loan made to Steve Compton, owner of the former Tater's Restaurant.

The move is designed to help Jennifer Baughn, who opened Ruby Nell's in the same location, purchase the building, said Alderman Bill Goodwine, overseer of the revolving loan fund.

Goodwine said Baughn will also take out a Small Business Administration loan and will receive another \$20,000 from the city's revolving loan.

The city approved a \$30,000 loan for Baughn to open the business and she had only taken \$10,000 of the total, Goodwine said.

The revolving loan was started many years ago when Schumacher Electric repaid a state loan to the city. The money was earmarked to provide loans not considered "bank-worthy," Goodwine said. Under program guidelines, each \$10,000 borrowed must result in one job.

The revolving loan fund currently has about \$20,000, Goodwine added.

In unrelated business, the council:

- Learned the water tower and ground storage tank will be inspected beginning April 3 when the water tower is drained. Work is expected to take about a week. Alderman Bill Crusinberry, water/sewer committee chairman, said residents should expect rusty water while the work is being done.
- Learned the city has received a court order allowing property at 204 E. Young to be demolished. Another property on Young is also on the list to be torn down.
- Heard from Alderman Ed Lotz that a 12'x20' building will be put in McFerren Park to accommodate auxiliary police equipment.
- Learned the parks department is accepting bids for weed control at city parks. Specifications are available from parks superintendent Eugene Warner. Bids will be opened at 10 a.m. April 7.
