Resident questions aspect of township building construction

A Hoopeston resident questioned the wisdom of using an out-of-state concrete finisher at the new township garage.

Mark Wagoner attended Tuesday afternoon's regular Grant Township Board meeting to ask why a contractor from Indiana was used to finish the garage floor. "I think that's bad business," he said.

Road Commissioner Gary Weinard explained that since the cost of the work was under \$20,000, officials did not have to seek bids. Weinard said he took project specs to four concrete companies seeking prices. Included in the four was Silver Brothers, a Hoopeston company, which did not submit a price quote by the deadline but did supply the concrete.

In fact, Weinard said, Chauncy Taylor of Taylor Concrete in Attica, Ind., was the only out-of-area contractor on the project. Dave Nelson of Hoopeston was the lead man for FBI Builders and building crew members were from Hoopeston and Rossville, he said. Local companies involved in the project included Sheridan's, Musk Plumbing and Ross Electric. When water and sewer lines are put in, Voyles Construction of Wellington is expected to do the job.

Council OKs land resolution

At a special meeting Tuesday afternoon, the Hoopeston City Council approved a resolution allowing the sale of a parcel of land at Hoopeston Plaza to an existing business.

Pizza Hut owner Mike Stegman has agreed to purchase the restaurant property but since the original subdivision required city council approval, the change also needed to be approved, said Alderman Bill Goodwine.

In related discussion, Weinard said he has received several compliments on the new garage building, located behind Hoopeston Area High School. Construction is expected to be completed by mid-May and an open house is being planned.

What will happen to the existing garage at 702 E. Orange is undecided. Weinard looked at the cost of moving it near the new garage, estimated to cost approximately \$10,000. Another option is to sell it. Some parties have expressed interest in purchasing it, he said.

In other action, by a 3-2 vote, trustees approved a \$100 donation towards a planter as part of Hoopeston's beautification project.

The planter project is being overseen by Hoopeston First Lady Claudia DeWitt who hopes local businesses will contribute to the cost of placing 30"x30 planters throughout the city.

Trustees Rich Thompson and Dale Lithgow voted against the contribution with Dave Ervin, Mike Eckersley and Bill Boose voting in favor. "I don't think
