Township officials are moving closer to selling the old township garage.

At Tuesday's regular meeting, the board heard from attorney Bill Nelson that the township should seek a letter of remediation from the State Fire Marshall's office about fuel storage tanks that had been on the property.

The letter, stating that the tanks were removed without contamination, would improve the property's saleable value.
