Hoopeston leaders working towards improving economy

Several things are coming together that local leaders hope will boost Hoopeston's economy.

"Obviously, it's a long process," said Lance Raver of the city's economic development steering committee. "It's longer than we thought. The good thing is, we're further along than we were a year ago. We're going to turn it around.

Raver made his comments at a meeting last Wednesday in which officials detailed what has been done about Hoopeston's economy.

Peace Corps Fellow Shannon Ruh, who is serving as the city's economic developer, outlined several areas in which progress has been made. They include:

Available industrial sites in the city. Ruh has identified sites and is meeting with owners to get options on the sites, allowing owners the opportunity to either sell their property or trade it. Options are being sought now so that if an opportunity becomes available, officials will be able to move quickly. "You have to know when you present land that it's available," said steering committee member Dick Read. Sites include the FMC building, which has been shown several times, and property along the rail line. Ruh is also working with developer Tom Lowe, who owns property north of the new CVS, to help market that property.

Regarding the FMC property, Mayor Bill DeWitt said different types of businesses have expressed interest in it, some reputable, some not. One proposal would split the building among several companies which could include manufacturing and warehousing. "Hopefully something will materialize but it just takes time," he said. "There'll never be another FMC and we don't need to look for it because it's not going to happen."

Ecological work. A second sampling has been done on the proposed site of a new motel and it "looks promising," Ruh said. A meeting June 12 will include representatives of Shaw Environmental, overseeing environmental work there, along with a local bank and Bhupendra Naik, who plans to build the motel. A plan for needed remediation will be addressed at the meeting. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency is expected to issue a No Further Remediation letter 30-90 days after remediation is done.

Web presences: a new web page is being developed at www.cityofhoopeston.org that will include information on the city council, including meeting minutes, along with economic development and tourism suggestions.

Residential: a developer is looking to purchase a large parcel of land to build residential housing, perhaps duplexes.

The economic development steering committee is trying to focus on things that will benefit the community, Read said, adding that people interested in opening a business in Hoopeston are concerned about more than just location. They want to know whether property has any archaeological concerns, wetlands issues, utility information and whether animals listed on the endangered species list will be affected.

And while it isn't in Hoopeston, Read said he learned the North Fork River, into which our water flows, has two endangered mussels in it.

Economic development "is just like fishing," he said. "You never catch the big fish the first time you throw it in the pond."

Read said he realized the importance of pushing for-
