Development foundation purchases FMC building

Developer hopes to fill vacant factory with new manufacturing, warehousing

A new owner has been found for the vacant FMC property in Hoopeston.

Business Reform Foundation recorded necessary paperwork Thursday at the Vermilion County courthouse, said Hoopeston Mayor Bill DeWitt in a telephone interview Friday.

The Ohio-based company develops properties for manufacturing and warehousing, DeWitt said. "They came on the picture about three or four months ago. They're a good company."

According to DeWitt, Business Reform Foundation will develop the property and attract smaller companies to the site. "There are companies that want to come there," he said.

Since taking office, DeWitt said he has been involved in showing the FMC building about 25 times. "It's finally paying off," he said. Some other companies that have toured the building are expected to locate there, he said.
