**Secretary of State candidate plans better customer service**

Dan Rutherford would like to improve service offered at the state's 130 Secretary of State offices. To accomplish that, he's challenging incumbent Jesse White for the job in the November election.

At a fundraising open house Thursday, Rutherford outlined his plan for streamlining service at the state's Department of Motor Vehicle offices, a plan that includes making better use of the Internet and credit cards.

Rutherford would like to revamp the system so people can use the Internet to schedule appointments at their local Secretary of State office, cutting the time people spend waiting. Each office would still take walk-in customers, like those who do not have Internet service.

Another change Rutherford would like to implement is to increase the number of offices that accept credit cards. Currently, he said, only 15 percent of offices accept Discover or debit cards.

Rutherford told a standing room crowd that his background in service will be an asset to the Secretary of State's office. "I've spent my adult life with a company that serves customers," he said, referring to ServiceMaster, a company he joined in 1985. Rutherford became responsible for expansion of the company's busi-

nesses internationally, licensing services in Chile, Brazil, Honduras, Japan, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Guam, Venezuela, South Africa, Spain, Czechoslovakia, Indonesia, Panama, Italy, Mexico and the Philippines.

ServiceMaster is a family of service companies with trade names such as ServiceMaster clean, Terminix, Tru-Green Chem Lawn, Merry Maids, American Home Shield and Rescue Rooter.

"The largest service component in our state government is the Secretary of State," Rutherford told the crowd at Ruby Nell's. "You need a leader in the largest component of service in government who comes from

the service industry."

To ensure good service from Secretary of State employees, Rutherford said he would visit each office during his first year in office. "For those who are doing a good job, I'm going to say 'thank you' and for those who need a little help, I'm going to 'encourage' them, and you know what I mean."

Rutherford admits his run against White is an uphill battle. "I know doggone good and well what we got into," he said, admitting he likes White. "Who can't like Jesse White," he asked. "He's a nice guy but he's not serving the public."

White has name recognition in Chicago, needed to win an election, but Rutherford is taking his battle to the north to get recognition. During the July 4th holiday, he appeared in parades in Wheaton, Glen Ellyn and Lisle and estimates he was exposed to well over 100,000 people by doing so. This week, he will speak on WLS-AM radio in Chicago, with an estimated audience of 1.5 million. "The stage we're walking on is huge," he said.

It's also expensive. Currently, Rutherford's war chest has about \$600,000, cash on hand. He estimated another \$400,000 is needed between now and the election, especially to reach the Chicago market. "You don't even begin to play for less than three-quarters of a million dollars," he said.

Besides gaining exposure, Rutherford is hoping Chicago Democrats will be disillusioned enough with Gov. Rod Blagojevich to stay away from the polls. "There's a lot of energy that Rod Blagojevich has got to go and that energy buoys all boats," he said.
