Hoopeston City Council takes action for new repair business

The Hoopeston City Council unanimously approved a conditional use permit, allowing a new paintless dent removal business to open in the city.

The action occurred at the council's regular meeting Tuesday night.

Tony Gress will operate the business from his home at 501 W. Chestnut, using technology that will allow him to remove up to softball-size dents from vehicles without repainting.

The Hoopeston plan commission had previously met and approved the conditional use, said Alderwoman Nancy Stipp.

Gress told the council that the process is good for hail damage and door dings and that only 30 percent of his business will be done at his home. The remainder will be mobile, he said.

In unrelated discussion, the council learned that repaving the McFerren Park tennis courts will be costly.

Last month, Alderman Bill Goodwine wondered if the company doing the city's street work would volunteer to resurface the courts. Alderman Carl Ankenbrand looked into the question and the short answer is "no."

The base estimate for resurfacing the courts with 1.5 inches of material is \$27,150, Ankenbrand said. Color-coating the courts would add another \$8,000.

Ankenbrand said the fence by the new playground equipment needs to be replaced. An estimate for that, from Alvin Fence Co., was \$9,000.




