# Three area residents attend community development session

Connie Cain. Jean Minick and Shannon Ruh participated recently with other community leaders in the Midwest Community Development Institute (CDI). CDI sharpens participants' skills and knowledge in community and economic development so that they can improve economic vitality of their communities. The event, hosted by the Illinois Institute for Rural Affairs (IIRA) at Western Illinois University, was held August 15-19 at the Stoney

Creek Inn.

CDI is a nationallyrecognized training program in community and economic

development designed for development professionals, community leaders, and elected officials. Participants are trained in the "how to" of community and economic development and learn techniques to bring positive change to their communities.

CDI attracted more than 65 participants from Illinois, Iowa, and Minnesota. "The participants were remarkably talented and diverse, including mayors, city council members, city and village administrators, staff from state and federal agencies, local economic developers, and community volunteers, said CDI director John Gruidl. "These folks are on the front lines, leading change in their communities".


The five-day CDI featured experts in community and economic development, including Robert Pittman from

Lockwood Greene, an engineering firm, who has 20 years helping businesses find sites internationally and June Holley, nationally-known for her success in promoting entrepreneurship in southeastern Ohio. Participants also had the opportunity for a field trip along the Moline Riverfront which is being converted from old industrial properties to an attractive urban environment.

Topics included facilitation skills, leadership, marketing your community, the role of the private sector in economic development, strategic planning, and fundraising. Participants had the opportunity to network with colleagues in the region facing similar challenges. Training is part of a three-year certification process and is held each August. Interested people are encouraged to attend next year's training August 13-17, 2007.
