### HA School Board unanimously approves teachers contract

The Hoopeston Area School Board has unanimously approved a three-year contract for district teachers.

The action came at Thursday night's regular board meeting after a closed session that included discussion on the contract and a student discipline issue.

Highlights of the contract include a 3.9 percent increase for each of the contract's three years, including steps and longevity. The increase is retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

Steps are increases in education and longevity is the number of years a teacher has been with the district.

Under the new contract, base pay will go up \$600 in each of the three years. Starting pay in the 2006-07 year will be \$25,575; \$26,175 in 2007-08; and \$26,775 in 2008-09.

Also approved in the contract was Fair Share, which calls for all new certified staff to pay their portion of union services. Currently, members of the Hoopeston Education Association pay dues of \$574, included \$145 to the National Education Association, \$397 to the Illinois Education Association and \$32 to the HEA.

Approximately 75 of the district's 102 teachers are HEA members.

Other components of the contract include an increase of two sick leave days per year, going from 10 to 12 and a retirement incentive of six percent, the maximum allowed by the Teachers Retirement System (TRS).

Under this item, teachers who plan to retire may request that they be taken off the salary schedule and instead get six percent raises for up to two years, said Superintendent Mark Conolly.

In order to qualify for this, teachers must have at least 25 years' service in the district, be at least 55 years old and have at least 35 years creditable service in TRS. Teachers who take advantage of this option must also submit a letter of resignation, he said.

The first year of the contract will mean an increase of \$205,000 over last year's agreement, Conolly said. The district will pay that increase with reserves in the education fund resulting from a 90 cent tax referendum passed about two years ago. The increase in taxes resulted in about an additional \$400,000 in the education fund budget.

Other income, including property tax and tuition, will also be used.

Additionally, the district will be faced with losing many long-term teachers in the next few years, Conolly said. Those teachers will be replaced with teachers on the lower end of the pay scale.

According to The Champion website, (www.thechampion.org) the average teacher salary at Hoopeston Area in 2005 was \$46,246. The highest teacher salary in the district was \$58,949 and the lowest was \$25,056.

Teacher and board negotiating teams have been working since April to hammer out a new contract. Last year's expired Aug. 31 but teachers have been working under its requirements this year. The sides met for more than 12 hours on October 30, coming to terms on an agreement.

The contract was ratified by the HEA on Novem-

While the contract is aimed at certified personnel, it also will affect non-certified employees such as aides, kitchen and janitorial staff. Those employees will receive a 45 cent per hour raise, Conolly said.

In unrelated action, the board:

• Unanimously approved the 2006 levy of \$3,089,805. Officials do not expect to receive the 9.1 percent increase over last year but requested the levy on the chance that the district's equalized assessed




