

## Ribbon-cutting marks opening of new Rossville Casey's

ROSSVILLE—It was a good morning Thursday here.

Employees at the new Casey's General Store greeted everyone with a cheerful "good morning" as they entered the new store, at the corner of Chicago and Attica streets.

Mayor Terry Prillaman was on hand to cut a ribbon marking the opening of the store, which was followed by grand opening specials and events Friday and Saturday.

"I'd like to welcome Casey's to Rossville in a place that holds so many memories for many of us," Prillaman said during the ceremony. "I wish you prosperity."

The store is located at the site of the February 2004 fire that left the corner empty of buildings and businesses that had been staples in the village for years.

Prillaman was upbeat about the addition of Casey's both for what it will bring to Rossville - increased revenue - both directly and indirectly.

Based on sales tax reports for similar communities, Prillaman estimated sales tax in the \$20,000-per-year range, plus an increase in property taxes for Rossville. Also, he said, people who drove through Rossville and saw an empty lot hopefully will stop to

pump gas and take a look around to see what else Rossville has to offer. "I really think there'll be a positive impact," he said.

Susan McGee of Hoopeston manages the new store, assisted by Lori Spann. In total, 15 people are employed by Casey's in Rossville, two full time and the rest part time. Most employees are from Rossville, McGee said.

Casey's will be open from 5 a.m.-11 a.m. seven days a week and will offer gas, convenience items and food, including breakfast pizzas, pizzas, sandwiches, doughnuts, coffee, soft drinks and cappuccino. An ATM is also available at the store.
