# Hoopeston man charged with having 114 lbs. of pot

LINCOLN, NEB-A Hoopeston man was arrested

Thursday after a traffic stop turned up an alleged 114 pounds of marijuana in the vehicle he was driving. Robert G. McCrory, 46, was arrested on suspicion of possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver, according to a report in the

Legend, for speeding. At about 3 p.m. Thursday, McCrory was eastbound on Interstate 80 near the downtown Lincoln exit when he was stopped.

The officer asked for consent to search the vehicle, which McCrory granted, according to published reports. Inside the trunk, the officer allegedly found two black duffel bags with 17 plastic-wrapped bales of marijuana.
