How many of you actually get your primary care in Danville, Watseka, Milford, Rossville, Paxton, Champaign and other cities now because your tired of the musical chair system that the management at our local facility continually use.

Don't you realize just how important a patientphysician relationship is? Every time a new doctor comes to town, it is necessary for them to learn all about the patients that they are responsible for taking care of. Our facilities make it impossible for them, because just as soon as they get to know us, they're fired.

There ought to be a board of every-day patients that work with all the people in our health care system, to insure that at least the management knows how the majority of patients feel on issues. No more closed doors, meeting, or minds.
