Hoopeston Area board to begin superintendent search Hoopeston Area school board members are beginning levels of service for searches that are available.

the search for a new superintendent.

At Thursday night's regular meeting, the board announced a special meeting to be held at 7 p.m. Wednesday.

The board will meet with Dave Love of the Illinois Association of School Boards to discuss how the IASB can help with a search for a new superintendent, said interim Superintendent Don Dean.

The board is looking for a new superintendent after the December 16 death of Mark Conolly.

Dean told the board that Love will discuss the two



levels of service for searches that are available. With the more in-depth service, at a cost of \$3,600, the IASB will help Hoopeston Area find a candidate that meets district needs. "It's not one size fits all," he said.

In unrelated action, a rural Hoopeston family will be allowed to take its 160 acre farm to the Paxton-Buckley Loda district if a similar land parcel is added to Hoopeston.

Dean told the board that an unnamed family, whose land borders the PBL district, would like to annex to the district so a child who has been home-schooled can take driver's education. Dean said the boy's mother told him the family shops and attends church in Paxton and therefore would like to annex their farm to the district.

"My feeling is if somebody is in this situation, it's better off to let them go and get on with their life," Dean said, adding Hoopeston Area would lose no state aid since the student is home-schooled, and little property tax on 160 acres.

However, board members worried that the action might start a precedent that would affect larger families and larger farms. "It's fine in this situation but what if their neighbor has 400 acres and five kids," said Russ
