Hoopeston Area board gets report on new behavior program

A program that rewards positive behavior is already getting results at Hoopeston Area Middle School and will spread to Honeywell and John Greer grade schools.

Ann Penicook, middle school dean of students, presented the Hoopeston Area board with information on Positive Behavior Intervention and Support at Thursday night's board meeting.

With PBIS, educators create a series of expectations for students. At the middle school, focus is on students being responsible, respectful and considerate. Expectations are coupled with settings, such as halls, classrooms and the cafeteria, to create a matrix.

Once that is created, behaviors are taught similar to academics, with modeling and practice of expected behaviors. Those behaviors are reinforced using "Cool Tools" such as role playing and acting out scenarios, Penicook said.

Students who are "caught" with good behavior are rewarded with respect tickets, which can be used to receive a piece of gum, or saved up for larger items. Five respect tickets equal a gold star ticket, which may also be saved to spend at the school's Respect Store, which is open once a month. There is also a monthly drawing for large items, such as a CD player, and for teachers, a drawing for gift certificates.

Each day, students are told the daily expectation and may be quizzed during the day on what the expectation is. Those who know it are rewarded with a respect ticket. Penicook said.

Currently, more than 600 schools use the PBIS system, which has been at the middle school for five months. Results can take three to five years, although, Penicook said, data shows some return on the program already. Horseplay is down at the middle school, as is the number of skipped teacher detentions.

Interim Superintendent Don Dean said the program is

a positive step for students. "A lot of times, you can't measure what it's preventing," he said. "It can pay off in a lot of ways."

In other business, the board heard from John Greer principal Dan Walder that this year's Summer Migrant Program will now cover part of Iroquois County, specifically the Watseka area.

Redistricting for the program took that area out of the Kankakee service area. The change could add about 30 children to the local program and "breathe new life into (it)," Walder said.
