

Hoopeston Fire Department receives communication grant

For Hoopeston firefighters, the question "can you hear me now" will be answered with a resounding "yes."

The Hoopeston Fire Department was recently awarded a \$53,476 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant, said Alderman Brandon Hamilton. He made the announcement at Tuesday night's Hoopeston

City Council meeting.

The grant includes money for one repeater, two base stations, three mobile radios, 19 portable radios, 16 pagers, six speaker/microphones for existing portable radios, an emergency decoder system for the main dispatch and a two-person intercom system.

The grant also covers fees for installing and programming equipment, installing the repeater on the water tower, licensing fees for a new narrow band frequency and repeater.

Another topic at the meeting was last week's snowstorm. Alderman Jerry Yonkers, street and alley superintendent, thanked all city departments that assisted his department in cleaning and removing snow. "They were really in a bind but everybody pitched in and helped out," he said.

Many residents thought city workers did a good job, too, based on cards and letters the city received about cleanup efforts, said Mayor Bill DeWitt.

Among those helping the department were water department employees, who were then assisted by two street and alley workers at a water main break Sunday by Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital. "Those guys worked 18 hours in a row, then came out to help us," said Alderman Bill Crusinberry. "We really appreciated it."

In related news, Crusinberry said crews are working at Vermilion Iron, trying to head off a potential problem. The plant closed recently, and when it did, the heat was shut off. Water lines froze during recent cold weather. "When it does thaw out, it's going to be like an open four-inch main," he said.

Crusinberry also requested that local snow removal companies notify the city if they knock off water main covers. Some were knocked off during snow removal and the meters became frozen, he said.
