department to pay salaries and pay for upkeep.

The department had a surplus of about \$700,000 several years ago but increased expenses, including purchasing about \$300,000 in new meters, has dropped the amount in the depreciation account to about \$250,000.

"Nobody wants to see a rate increase but I pay \$12 a month and that's ridiculous," Steiner said. Somebody needs to take the bull by the horns and raise the rates."

Crusinberry said rates have not been increased for four or five years. The first step in raising them is to have a rate study done, comparing rates area communities. Also, he said, the city needs to look for grants that might help pay at least some of the costs of updating water mains, some of which were installed in the late 1800s.

Crusinberry said his top priority when named to the water committee was rehabilitating the city's water storage tanks. That project, which has a \$300,000 price tag, will be followed by the water main problem and the flooding situation.

In unrelated business, the council:
