Township residents request action on rural rail crossing

Some Grant Township residents want township officials to take on the CSX Railroad.

John Hathaway, Tom Schmitz and Geraldine Durocher attended Tuesday afternoon's Grant Township Board of Trustees meeting to discuss the condition of the crossing on County Road 3650.

Hathaway, who said he talked to Township Supervisor Bill Boose and Road Commissioner Gary Weinard in mid-December, told the board he has also talked to attorney George Cuonzo, who represented Milford in its efforts to get a crossing repaired.

After Cuonzo filed legal papers for the village, "the railroad miraculously appeared and the crossings were fixed," Hathaway said, adding the attorney is "apparently able to get things done."

Township attorney Bill Nelson said he talked with Cuonzo, who told him he did not file a suit against the railroad but did file a formal complaint with the Illinois Commerce Commission. Nelson said Cuonzo reported to him that the CSX did the work specified in the complaint but no more and that the Milford crossing was still not fixed satisfactorily. When Milford officials complained, CSX officials "basically

told them to file another complaint," Nelson said.

Boose has been in contact with ICC representative Henry Humphries, who said the ICC can do little because the CSX is taking some action towards fixing crossings on its line from South Chicago to Evansville, Ind.. The railroad plans to begin using hot patch to repair crossings on April 15. Work on local crossings is expected to be completed by mid-May.

"Maybe I don't want to wait that long," Hathaway said, adding if something is not done, he, represented by Cuonzo, would file a complaint with the ICC and bill the township for the cost.

Nelson responded that township officials are under no obligation to pay such a bill.

"That's when the fun will start," Hathaway shot back.

Weinard said that while he sympathizes with residents, the railroad right-of-way is "like a sovereign country" and, as private property, cannot be fixed by anyone but the railroad.

Grant Township has four crossings - three south of


