## Physician assistant initiates reading intervention program

Keith Whitaker, Hoopeston Regional Health Center Physician Assistant, went on a healthcare mission trip to Haiti last summer and came home with a new program that will be used in the Hoopeston and Cissna Park Medical Clinics.

While the mission trip was deeply moving on a personal level, it was also beneficial to both communities because another participant introduced Whitaker to the "Reach Out and Read" program. Anita Berry, who has been heavily involved in setting up similar programs, talked with Whitaker about the benefits of the program. He felt it would be beneficial to offer it locally.

Once he was back in the states, Whitaker attended formal training so that he could train other providers on the program before the January 2007 implementation date.

The program is based on the belief that literacy should become a standard part of pediatric primary care, so that children grow up with books and a love of reading. Parents are encouraged to read with their children starting at an early age. Developmentally appropriate books are given during each well-child exam for children six months to five years, for a total of 10 books per child.

During exams providers also discuss the benefits of reading with parents and educate them that they are the

key to a successful program. Reading aloud is important because it fosters language development, promotes reading skills, motivates a child to love books and prepares a child for success in school.

Studies have shown that a child's language evolves primarily through their parent(s) and that by age two, a child's language skills will likely correlate with later cognitive performance. This program provides informa-
