



Patrick Quinn to speak at Hoopeston monument dedication

Illinois Lieutenant Governor Patrick Quinn is scheduled to be the keynote speaker at Sunday's "Lest They Be Forgotten" monument dedication.

The monument is in memory of PFC Jeffrey R. Wallace who was killed May 24, 2006 in Iraq.

Quinn, a supporter of military personnel and the USO, came to Hoopeston for Mr. Wallace's visitation and has remained in contact with the family.

He is scheduled to speak at the dedication, which begins at 1 p.m. Sunday at the south end of McFerren Park. Residents are invited to attend.

The "Lest They Be Forgotten" monument depicts a soldier's helmet atop a weapon positioned between combat boots. It was created by Gregg Garvey who lost his son in the Iraq war. The monument has become available to families and communities that want to commemorate soldiers' sacrifices.

During the July 3, 2006 Salute to Hometown Heroes, Dave McFadden announced that Hoopeston would raise funds for the monument. Donations were collected and the monument was expected to arrive in Hoopeston last week.

A Hoopeston couple is scheduled to be arraigned today on charges that they illegally restrained a woman in their home.

Barbara A. Schwartz, 64, and Ronald H. Schwartz, 66, of 724 S. Fourth St., have been charged with unlawful restraint, a Class 4 felony.

According to police Chief Mark Drollinger, on March 30, officers responded to the Schwartz home to investigate a call for help. A neighbor had reported a woman's voice calling for help inside the home.

Inside the home, officers allegedly found a 42-yearold handicapped woman bound to a bed with a chain and padlock at her ankle. She was alone at the time.

The woman was taken to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital for observation and evaluation.

The case was referred to the Vermilion County State's Attorney's office for review of preliminary charges of criminal neglect of a disabled person and unlawful restraint and to the Illinois Inspector General and Attorney General's offices, Drollinger said.

The woman, of whom the Schwartzes were guardians for approximately 10 years, was the subject of an emergency guardianship hearing in April. The state currently has temporary guardianship of the woman.




