Township officials look at ways to pay for fire protection

Grant Township officials are once again looking at ways to generate more income for the fire department that provides coverage in rural township areas.

At Tuesday afternoon's regular meeting, Supervisor Bill Boose presented information on the number of fires the Hoopeston Fire Department has responded to in rural Grant Township. Boose said that according to information provided, the fire department responded to 21 country calls in 2005-06, including vehicle-related calls.

Under an agreement between the city and township, the department provides fire coverage in the rural area. Currently, the township pays \$13,000 annually for the

coverage. Fire officials want the amount raised to \$30,000 per year.

Since the increase was requested last year, township officials have questioned whether the city might bill residents' homeowners insurance, which usually includes fire protection coverage. "It seems to me, if we're trying to come up with additional money, that would be the place to start," Boose said.

At Tuesday's meeting, that issue was again discussed, with attorney Bill Nelson telling trustees he plans to contact the Illinois Commissioner of Insurance about the issue, specifically whether residents may be billed for fire protection when they are also taxed for it. If that is

true, Nelson wondered whether the township should do away with the tax levy for fire protection so that residents could be billed on a per-fire basis.

Grant officials are trying to come to terms with the amount of increase requested by the fire department. Trustee Dale Lithgow said he told Alderman Brandon Hamilton, city fire committee chairman, that if the township agrees to the increase, it will have to be done in stages.

Any increase would result in an increase in the tax levy and that should be decided by October, Boose said.

who guide callers through the steps they need to take to quit tobacco. "Trained counselors are available from 7am to 7pm Monday through Friday," Bolton said, adding, "The Illinois Quitline counselors are great, and you can call them as often as you may need help."

Through funding from the Illinois Tobacco-free Communities grant, the Vermilion County Health Department offers 4 weeks of free nicotine replacement patches for county residents who use the Quitline services, or who participate in the health department's cessation classes. The health department received just over \$28,000 during the current grant year, which ends June 30. "We expect to receive about \$20,000 in the new grant year, and we will set aside as much of that money as we are able for patches," Bolton said. There were 309 calls from Vermilion County to the Quitline in 2006.

Bolton said it is especially important not to smoke around children. "If you're not ready to quit, then smoke outside and away from your children, and never smoke if your kids are in your vehicle," she said. Tobacco-free Kids estimates almost 60% of children in the United States (ages 3-11) are exposed to secondhand smoke, putting them at risk for lower respiratory and ear infections, and asthma.
